Dear Prof. Hoffmann:

Thank you very much indeed for your recently arrived letters of 15 August and 29 September. It was kind of you to remember my CLA and Beneventan investigations, and, of course, I am delighted to have this new information.

A new set of 'Addenda to CLA' is in course of preparation by Prof. James John and myself. I hope that you will allow us to include, please, your important discovery of Kleemann 16. I shall write for a reproduction of Kleemann 22 in the expectation that this fragment too is a candidate for inclusion in the new Addenda.

As you can imagine, Prof. Bischoff's legendary generosity was indispensable in assembling material for the previous two sets of Addenda published in Mediaeval Studies 1985 and 1992. I would be most grateful if you could let me know, please, of any more new CLA items which you or other scholars discover. This would be of enormous assistance in our search for new CLA specimens. My colleague Roger Reynolds has told me that you are presently exploring various archives in Germany; I am optimistic that more relevant CLA material will emerge.

I would also appreciate it if you could send me, please, a xerox of your photographs of Jena MS. G. B. f. 32 (1). To judge from the measurements, contents and provenance, this could be, perhaps, a membrum disiectum from the same codex as Jena Fragm. lat. 5? Enclosed is my description of the latter, along with xeroxes of my photographs. Needless to say, I am always looking for new Beneventana, and I will gratefully receive any information in this regard.
