The APPI was organized on January 1, 1960, at New York City, New York, under the leadership of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The party was formed as a result of the merger of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).
