Fragments of six leaves of a papyrus codex survive ( the fragment of another leaf, the sixth in the original order, seen and copied by

in is now lost ); the fragments are now kept between glass in three frames. The largest fragment now measures 175 x 90 mm. Calculated written space ca. 245 x ca. 170 mm. in ca. 30 long lines. Deletion by cross-strokes through and dots above the letters. The tituli are numbered by Greek numerals. The marginal drection 'REGULA' has groups of parallel horizontal kines and vertical flour-ishes above and below. Omitted M at line-end denoted by a simple horizontal with dot below, omitted N also at line-end by a simple stroke over the letter. Every page begins with a considerably larger letter. Ink dark brown or black. Script is a large uncial of the type common in legal MSS. written in Byzantium or in the East; the most characteristic letter is the tall B; bows are full and round the type common of R goes well below the line.

Written in the eastern part of the Roman empire. Later history unknown; the fragments were discovered at Pommersfelden by Savigny before 1812.
