(200 x 120 mm.) in 25 long lines. Ruling usually
on the hair-side, two or four leaves at a time before fold-
ing. Double bounding lines to each column. Prickings
^{near or between the body lines}
in the margin guided the ruling. Gatherings mostly of
eights, hair-side sometimes facing flesh within the quire,
signed once ^{once f (57v)} λ , once q II in the centre of the lower
margin of the last page. Titles in Greek capitals in
black. Punctuation irregular: occasionally ;, or the
medial point mark the main pause. Omissions are marked
in a later hand by signes de renvoi. Abbreviations

include technical terms and b; b; = bus; q, q; q =
que; aut = autem; e, ee = (est, esse); h = haec; not, 45
nri, nrum = noster, nostri, nostrum; n or ny = nus;

once 'cassus' for 'casus'. Probably copied from an Anglo-
Saxon exemplar in an Anglo-Saxon centre. Triangular groups
