4. (fols.1-6) Kalendar

The following feasts associated with the Cistercian order are marked with twelve lessons: William of Bourges (Jan.10), nativity (Mar.22), and translation (Jul.11) of Benedict, Robert of Molesmes (Apr.29), Bernard (Aug.20), with octave (also twelve lessons), Malachy (Nov.5), Edmund archbishop of Canterbury (Nov.16), Peter of Tarentaise (May 8) in red but without grading.

'Commemoratio parentum nostrorum' (Nov.20), cf. Nomasticon Cisterciense, ed. Sejalon, (Solesmes, 1892), p.188. Florentius bishop of Strasbourg (Nov.7) added in cursive hand.
